

“Benedict, † 547; wrote famous monastic Rule noted for its wisdom, moderation, and need for obedience: “Let all follow the Rule as their guide in everything, and let no one rashly depart from it” (Rule, Chapter 3); founded twelve monasteries including Monte Cassino; Benedictines [O.S.B.] today number some 6,665 religious; considered the “Patriarch of Western Monasticism”; a patron of Europe.”



Reflection on the Readings

This Sunday’s gospel reading involves Jesus sending out his disciples, “ahead of him”. This would be the second time in the gospel; the only difference from Luke 9:1-6 is the number of disciples that were sent. His instructions can be compounded to: To fully trust God that he provides and to cure the sick, in places that receive the disciples”.

Luke 10:1 sent for 72 disciples, and they were paired off. Their destination is a Samaritan village that denied Jesus entry due to his destination being Jerusalem (Lk 9:52). As such, with Samaritan’s culture of hospitality, Jesus instructs the disciples to enjoy one household’s reception and to not go to another host. Like Lk 9:5, the disciples were instructed to “shake the dust from their feet” when they are not received. As the disciples returned to Jesus’ side, they were amazed and rejoiced at how they were able to subjugate demons in Jesus’ name. Lk 10: 18-20 has Jesus give the disciples a reminder. That reminder is that they are doing these things for Heaven, before they become self-inflated.

What does this gospel mean for us today? Firstly, when we try to preach the Good News, the Good News will be heard by those who are willing to receive it. Too many times, we proselytize or force people to convert to Christianity. If we look to the early Christian communities, they did no such thing. Proselytization of Christianity started when the Roman Emperor, Constantine I, converted to the way. Likewise, the Roman citizens followed suit, to not get into conflict with the emperor. Conversion should be real as Jesus’ love for us.

The second message is when we minister to others, either with words and/ or actions. Ministry is doing things with God as the center, not ourselves. Lk 10:18 has Jesus witnessed Satan’s fall from grace, as the disciples knew why he fell. Satan became prideful and thus rejected God’s reign (CCC 391-395). God loves humanity and we are to transmit that same love to others. So let us pray that we don’t get too proud of ourselves and always remember that the things we do are for our heavenly homeland.
