

Reflection on the Readings

This Sunday's gospel passage involves a prayer that Jesus has taught us. The Lord's Prayer or the Our Father is also present in Matthew's gospel. Prayer consists of a state of acknowledging God the Father, providing our needs, and forgiving our sins as we forgive others.

The second part of Luke's gospel (11:5-8) involves how one's relationship with God is. With the Lord's Prayer in mind, the one praying needs some level of persistence. A good friend will eventually come to your aid as the lesson of the parable. An example of this could be seen with the first reading from Genesis, as Abraham had asked if the Lord was going to destroy the innocent along with the guilty of Sodom and Gomorrah. Abraham, though cautious as not to incur wrath, had asked each time with the number of people who are innocent. With each decreasing number of innocents, the Lord would spare his wrath, on account of those innocent people.

The last part of the gospel passage, Luke 11: 9-13 emphasizes how God will answer one's prayers. God will give good, not evil. Though many times it would seem God does not answer our prayers, it is rather the opposite. He knows what is good for us and what we need. As it is asked in Lk 11: 11-12, what kind of Father gives his child the opposite of what they need? God the Father never stops loving us, we just need to be open and put our trust in him. We have to remember, even though we had prayed for something, it is ultimately up to God how he answers our prayers. For some of us, God's answers are unexpected.

As often as we become disheartened when prayers go unanswered or things don't go our way. We lose our faith when we try to pray to exactly how things we want to be and try to blame God for such unfulfilled pleas. Let us pray for an increase in faith in our Lord and to be more open to his will.



Saints Martha, Mary, and Lazarus

Memorial

The Memorial of Saints Martha, Mary, and Lazarus was officially established by the Catholic Church in 2021. Prior to this, July 29 was celebrated as the Memorial of Saint Martha alone, while her siblings Mary of Bethany and Lazarus were not included in the universal liturgical calendar. On January 26, 2021, the Congregation for Divine Worship, under the direction of Pope Francis, issued a decree adding Mary and Lazarus to the celebration. The memorial was renamed to reflect their shared role in the Gospels and their close friendship with Jesus. This change honors their united witness of faith, hospitality, and devotion.
