Reflection on the Readings

Continuing from last week's gospel passage, Jesus stresses that our treasures in heaven are important. This week, Jesus mentions that our treasure is where one's heart is. Then the passage comes with a parable of a servant awaiting their master's return from a wedding.

Why would a servant be waiting for their master's return from a wedding? First, the "wedding" mentioned here is an apocalyptic symbol for the kingdom. Second, in the ancient Jewish wedding custom, the wedding ceremony is at the bride's family house. While the wedding feast occurs at the groom's house, hence why servants would be waiting for their master from his wedding ceremony. There is a twist, however, as to reward their servants, the master invites the servants to the table. The master would then serve his servants.

"Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?" as Peter asks in Luke 12:41. The author of Luke's gospel answers Peter that involves the audience. Peter's question is also placed after an eschatological tension with Luke 12:40, we know the Lord is coming...we just don't know when. Jesus continues to speak of stewardship in order to address said gospel verse. In short, the passage is for us to always take care of what is given to us.

The next parable Jesus tells is about servants who do not know when their master is returning and start to abuse or shirk from their responsibilities. Jesus notes that not all servants who abuse their positions have the same degree of intention. The message is clear for all generations, those given more responsibilities have more expectations. Meaning, the more intentional one is shirking from their responsibilities, the harsher the punishment.

Knowing when a test comes makes it easier for one to be responsible. However, when that time isn't clear, would we slack off or remain responsible? Jesus warns us to be vigilant until it is time. Is our hearts set in heaven or are they on things that will not last? Let us pray for each other and work with each other to store up treasures in heaven.




