

Reflection on the Gospel

"Some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last. Luke 13:30. As Jesus' journey heads to Jerusalem, this gospel passage has an apocalyptic theme to it. When the time comes, are we prepared to enter the kingdom of God?"

The narrow gate, or the eye of the needle (as referenced later in Luke 18:25) needs some explanation. As seen in the picture above, there is a gate and a smaller door within the gate. The bigger gate is used for caravans and merchants and is only open during the day. The smaller door allows for foot traffic and is open a little longer when the primary gate is closed.

How can a master be cruel when he ate and drank with the people he locked outside? Much worse, when he declares that he does not know them? With the above context and from previous gospel passages, we see an answer. Recall how the kingdom of God is there and how our hearts' treasure is there. Many people come to the gates of the kingdom with their earthly treasures and they find the primary gate closed, save for the smaller gate. Do they abandon their camels and possessions and hurry for the narrow gate?

Luke 13:24 has Jesus answering how to be saved. He tells us to strive to enter through the narrow door, but not all will be strong enough. Strength, in this case, is not physical strength. It is rather a test of faith. Meaning some will stay with their camels and possessions and not enter through the narrow gate. The people, who are locked out, try to use their initial relationship to appeal to the master. However, the master does not recognize them, as they did not do the Father's works. The master had already appealed to them during their initial relationship when he taught in their synagogues.

We are the first ones to hear of God's love. Do we share the words of everlasting life with those who are last in life? Jesus' expectations for us are to serve one another as we are all equal in God's eyes. Let us continue to pray for one another and to assist each other in this life.
