Memorial of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Memorial of Saint Cecilia

Saint Cecilia is the patron saint of music, known for her deep love of God and her joyful singing during prayer. Even in difficult moments, she stayed faithful and inspired others with her courage and devotion. She reminds us that music and faith can bring hope and beauty into the world.



Reflection on the Readings

Probably one of humanity's curiosities is, "When will the world end?". *Apocryphal* writings are around in the Bible, usually with the purpose of assurance to a community that is under some form of persecution. The gospel passage for this Sunday doesn't answer when the end happens, but what will happen.

The primary audience of Luke's gospel is Gentile converts. The passage starts with signs that will occur around the world, from natural disasters and man-made events. The gospel passage then addresses the faithful, what they will face during persecution for believing in Jesus Christ. Other gospel accounts have had whole families being converted to the faith; however, it was not the case for some individuals. For them, they chose the faith while even their own families and friends would hand them over to Jewish authorities or the Roman Empire.

The Second Letter of Paul to the Thessalonians gives us a glimpse of Paul's zeal for his ministry and his hope for the Christian community in Thessalonica. Paul and his cohorts have worked hard to be examples for the community. Needless to say, Paul and his fellow apostles were imitating Jesus, who taught them to do so. This is how to keep the faith, by imitating Christ himself.

Coming back to the gospel passage of today, *perseverance* is what will secure our lives (Luke 21:19). However, notice that this gospel passage is a continuation of last week's cleansing of the temple. So what is meant by "securing our lives", especially when the message is towards a persecuted community? As Jesus raised his temple after three days, those who kept their faith will share in his resurrected life. Those who are persecuted on account of their faith, their sufferings are also Jesus' sufferings. Not all of us will face martyrdom, but we are to imitate Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. And regardless of our fates, God will reign at the end.



Neocatechumenal Way

An Announcement of Joy! Does God still speak to us today as He did in the time of Abraham and the Exodus from the slavery of Egypt? If Jesus said he would be with his Church until the end of time, then where is he today? Many of us believe that Jesus Christ is still present today in the same way he has always been since his Ascension, but our lived experience suggests that it is more of a faint hope than a lived experience. But to discover that the history of Abraham's journey of faith is identical to our own, and the escape of Moses and the Hebrew people from the bondage of slavery is no different than what the Lord wants to accomplish in us today is to

discover Him speaking to us in His Word. And to meet Jesus Christ, this same Word made flesh, in his Church. This discovery is the beginning of walking in a way of faith in a Community of concrete brothers and sisters, not as an anonymous person within a mass of people but in the communion of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church.
