Who is Pope Leo XIV?
Prior to his election as Pope Leo XIV, Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost was Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops. The new Bishop of Rome was born on September 14, 1955, in Chicago, Illinois, to Louis Marius Prevost, of French and Italian descent, and Mildred Martínez, of Spanish descent. He has two brothers, Louis Martín and John Joseph.

On September 1 of the same year, Prevost entered the novitiate of the Order of Saint Augustine (O.S.A.) in Saint Louis, in the Province of Our Lady of Good Counsel of Chicago, and made his first profession on September 2, 1978. On August 29, 1981, he made his solemn vows.

In Rome, he was ordained a priest on June 19, 1982, at the Augustinian College of Saint Monica by Archbishop Jean Jadot.

Pope Francis created him Cardinal in the Consistory of September 30 that year and assigned him the Diaconate of Saint Monica. He officially took possession of it on January 28, 2024.

Reflection on the Readings

When it comes to who is exactly a Gentile, there is a conundrum as even saying a “non-Jew” does not cover the whole truth. Romans, Samaritans, and even the descendants of Jews that stayed in Israel during the Babylonian Exile are a part of this vague category of people. Regardless of our own ancestry, isn’t all of humanity originates as God’s creation?

The first reading has Paul and Barnabas being urged to return to the Jewish faith. These converts to Judaism have a problem with Paul and Barnabas for converting Gentiles. Seeing how greater, in number, the Gentile converts are to the way, this sparks some jealousy. Paul and Barnabas were also trying to convert Jews to the way, but once they saw their progress halting, they turned to the Gentiles. The Gentiles were very happy to hear that they are part of God’s salvation.

The second reading, from the Book of Revelation, talks about the white-robed army. These people, whom we can call martyrs, have no distinct origin. These people have kept their faith despite the dangers they have faced. At this point of the Apocalypse, there are two groups: the faithful believers and the unbelievers. A nation of those who lived worshiping God and nations that defy God and dwell on earthly matters.

The short gospel passage of John reflects a reality: “what belongs to God also belongs to Jesus”. The gospel doesn’t specify what belongs, but we can say all of creation belongs to the Father. The Son, or the Lamb, is in the center of it all. Jesus is the one who leads us to eternal life with the Father and at the same time, he is also the center of our lives. Nothing can change that, no matter the turmoil we face, as salvation can be for everyone. Let us pray that we recognize the Master’s voice and follow him.


