Reflection on the Readings

Today we celebrate the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed or as we all know, "All Souls Day". This day we remember those who have passed on, or in better words, awaiting for the Resurrection.

One of life's mystery's is there a life after dead? The questions had led to many debates, over centuries even among the Jewish communities. The Sadducees, in particular, rejected the resurrection, which other Jews believed in. We have a glimpse of the Truth, Jesus Christ who was crucified, died, was buried, and rose from the dead.

Keeping in mind the passage from John's gospel, Jesus came to humanity by the Father's will. Jesus' love for us is vast and deep, that he was willing to die for us. As we know, Jesus' life did not stop at his death as the Father resurrected him. Jesus would not lose anything (or anyone) given to him, as he will also raise them up (John 6:39). Through believing in him, we share in his resurrection (CCC 998-991).

Our role, as the Church on Earth, pray for those on the way to the kingdom. Rather it be our loved ones and those who are long gone, we are the Church. If we believe in Christ, Christ shares his Resurrection with us. While still in our earthly lives, we should spread that same love Jesus gave us, to others.

An Announcement of Joy! Does God still speak to us today as He did in the time of Abraham and the Exodus from the slavery of Egypt? If Jesus said he would be with his Church until the end of time, then where is he today? Many of us believe that Jesus Christ is still present today in the same way he has always been since his Ascension, but our lived experience suggests that it is more of a faint hope than a lived experience. But to discover that the history of Abraham's journey of faith is identical to our own, and the escape of Moses and the Hebrew people from the bondage of slavery is no different than what the Lord wants to accomplish in us today is to

discover Him speaking to us in His Word. And to meet Jesus Christ, this same Word made flesh, in his Church. This discovery is the beginning of walking in a way of faith in a Community of concrete brothers and sisters, not as an anonymous person within a mass of people but in the communion of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church.
