Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

Aloha St. Patrick Parishioners,

ALLELUIA! CHRIST HAS RISEN! ALLELUIA!

From Galilee to Jerusalem, Jesus has walked, performing miracles, healing the sick, casting out demons, and teaching and reminding people of God's love for them. Even in his last days, he continued to love each and every one of us. At the Upper Room, he washed his disciples' feet and instituted the Eucharist, so that the apostles themselves could pass on that same love. In his final moments, Jesus was beaten, scourged, made to carry a cross, crucified on that same cross, and died, thinking of us.

On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead as part of God's will. A light illuminated that morning, one that was as radiant as the sun, or perhaps brighter? Jesus appeared to those he loves, showing that he has truly risen. Those who didn't recognize him at first simply didn't recognize him in his full glory. ALLELUIA! The once-afraid disciples were given new hope as their master, king, and friend stood before them. With courage, these apostles came out of hiding to preach the *Good News*.

For centuries, the gospel of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection has been told to countless believers throughout the world. For forty days, we've gone through repentance and renewing our belief in the Gospel. Indeed, it is cause for joyful celebration, as Jesus resurrected, he did first what we would do in the future. Partaking with Jesus in the Resurrection would not be possible if we hadn't gone through *metanoia*, or a *change so deep*, that allows God's love to thrive again.

My sisters and brothers in Christ, Jesus' story did not end at the tomb; it continues through us. In these next 50 days for the Season of Easter, we hear what was preached about the Resurrected Christ. For we too are instruments in the Resurrection as we live in Christ's love. That same love we show to our families, friends, and to each other. Let us continue to preach the Risen Christ, not only with our words, but with our daily actions as well.

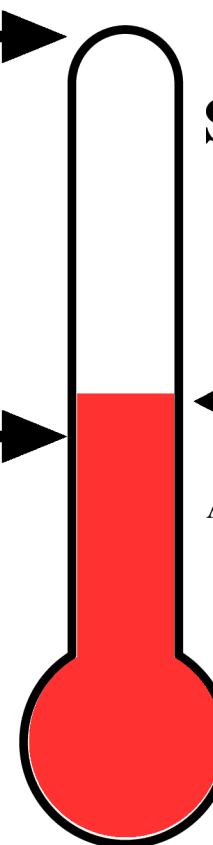
