The Annunciation of the Lord
Solemnity



The Annunciation celebrates the moment when the angel Gabriel announced to Mary that she would conceive and bear the Son of God. Though surprised, Mary responded with faith and humility, saying yes to God's plan. At that moment, by the power of the Holy Spirit, the Word became flesh in her womb. This feast reminds us to trust in God's will and respond with openness and courage.

Reflection on the Gospel

The Greek gods, Hypnos and Thanatos, are the gods of sleep and death, respectively. The reason for mentioning this is to give context to how both sleep and death are thought of. Both are a state of a mortal life. Sleep is giving rest to the body, while death is an eternal sleep. The personifications are fitting as Hypnos and Thanatos are twins.

The original audience of John's gospel is a mixed community of Jewish and Gentile converts. As such, the gospel explains to non-Jews certain Jewish customs, along with explaining Greek understandings to non-Gentile converts. Jesus telling the disciples that Lazarus is simply sleeping is such an example. To the disciples, they weren't aware that he is dead. To Jesus, there is no such distinction, but he knew the disciples misunderstood.

Now imagine yourself being at the tomb of Lazarus. To those who believed in Jesus being the resurrection and the life, it must've been a wondrous sight. What about those who didn't believe? It might've been a terrifying sight. Regardless, no alternate explanations can be given as people knew Lazarus died four days prior and the stone blocking the tomb wasn't moved.

What is seen with Lazarus was already a great event. However, what is the difference between Lazarus and Jesus? The difference is that Lazarus still had a mortal life, thus still susceptible to a mortal's death. Some theologians would call such an event a resuscitation. Based on people who were brought back to life from the brink of death. (In present day, the Lazarus Syndrome are rare cases of people being declared dead and start showing signs of life afterwards.) As opposed to the Resurrection, of which the faithful share in Jesus' eternal life.

From what we see, eternal rest is only temporary to the Resurrection and the Life. Jesus will one day raise the dead and bring them with him to eternal life. As Easter draws closer, let us continue our Lenten practices, that bring us back to Jesus.

Vision Statement

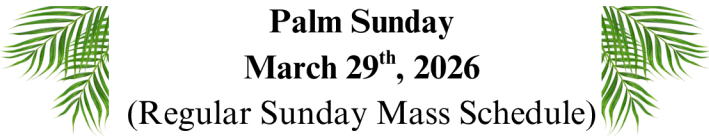
We are a loving community witnessing and living the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

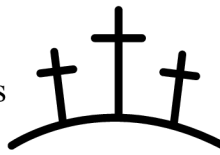

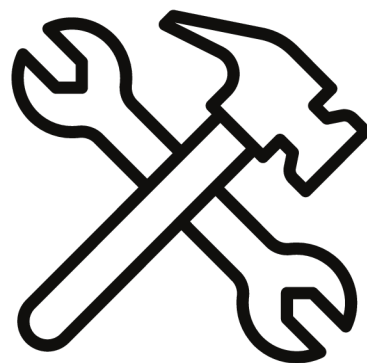

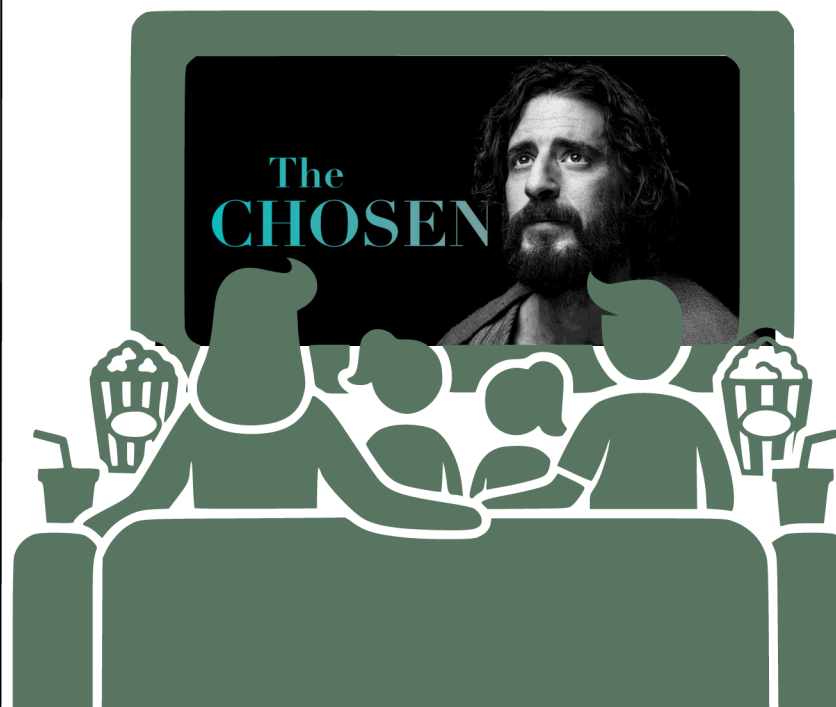
