





## Fifth Sunday of Lent



### First Reading

-Isaiah 43:16-21

*“See, I am doing something new and I give my people drink.”*

### Responsorial Psalm

-Psalm 126:1-2,2-3,4-5,6

*“The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.”*

### Second Reading

-Philippians 3:8-14

*“Because of Christ, I consider everything as a loss, being conformed to his death.”*

### Gospel Reading

-John 8:1-11

*“Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.”*

### Gospel Reflection

“Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more.” Imagine how the woman felt when Jesus told her that. After all, she was caught, dragged through the streets, publicly humiliated, and was set to be stoned to death. Would you feel like you were granted a second chance at life?

What were the Scribes and Pharisees trying to prove? These groups were focused on entrapping Jesus, giving a cause to imprison him. Their priority was not the woman in sin and for justice to be done, she was a convenient victim for them to use. Jesus knew the plan of the Scribes and Pharisees and used the opportunity to remind them of who can actually judge. Since no one was without sin in the group, they had no choice but to agree with Jesus’ words. Jesus remained behind and he is the sinless one, he did not condemn her and instead chose to forgive her sins.

How harsh must we judge others and the manner as well? Being stoned to death is a brutal sentence, but what reason do we have to throw the stone at someone? The Scribes and Pharisees wanted to fulfill their own egos, not really caring for the woman’s justice. How is it when we judge others? Using social norms as an excuse in order to make ourselves feel better is no different from the Scribes and Pharisees.

The gospel passage reminds us that God is the one that judges us. At the same time, Jesus gives us the opportunities in our lifetimes to turn away from sin. Would it be ironic if former sinners judged their fellow sinners? Lent is a time to look inwardly at our own selves, to prepare for Jesus’ resurrection, and join him in his resurrection.


