

Saint Stephen The First Martyr

Saint Stephen, honored as the first martyr of the Church, was one of the first deacons chosen to serve the early Christian community with



faith and charity. Filled with the Holy Spirit, he boldly proclaimed that Jesus is the Messiah, even when his message angered the authorities. As he was being stoned to death, Stephen forgave his persecutors and entrusted his spirit to God, echoing the words of Christ on the cross. His witness reminds parishioners that true discipleship requires courage, faith, and love, even in the face of suffering. Saint Stephen's life calls us to stand firm in our faith and to respond to hatred with forgiveness and trust in God.
