## Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

### First Reading

-Isaiah 50:4-7

*"My face I did not shield from buffets and spitting, knowing that I shall not be put to shame."*

### Responsorial Psalm

-Psalm 22:8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24

*"My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"*

### Second Reading

-Philippians 2:6-11

*"Christ humbled himself. Because of this God greatly exalted him."*

### Gospel Reading

-Luke 22:14-23-56

*"The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ."*

### Gospel Reflection

The narrative from Luke's gospel on Palm Sunday and from John's gospel on Good Friday has a unique involvement. Rather than only a cleric reading the gospel, it involves a narrator, a reader of Jesus' words, a speaker for other important characters, and finally involving the congregation. The speaking roles that the congregation are given are spoken by unnamed characters.

The question that is being asked here is: are we no different from the people from 2,000 years ago? Adding some historical context, crucifixion was both a torture and an execution, that was the highest form of punishment for the Roman Empire. Jesus was sentenced twice by that same empire. First, was when Jesus was scourged at the pillar. When the Pharisees were not satisfied, they incited the crowd and forced Pontius Pilate to sentence Jesus to crucifixion.

It is important to note that the Church is not insinuating that all the common folk share responsibility in sentencing Jesus, even generations later. After all, the gospel used before we processed in with palms, were held by the same common people that welcomed Jesus as King. Would we have done the same if we were in the people of Jerusalem's shoes? It is all human reactions that we share, yet Jesus asks his Father to forgive those, "who do not know what they are doing" (Luke 23:34).

There are many characters that remained unnamed in the gospel narratives, but they share similarities with us today. The repentant thief and the soldier, that declares Jesus as the Son of God (in Matthew's gospel), come to mind. Starting with the Roman Centurion, the irony that a Gentile and not a Jew, declares Jesus the Son of God. The repentant thief (who is named Dismas in some accounts), who acknowledges that he is a criminal and deserving of his sentence, asks Jesus to be remembered. Both of these men show their conversion of their beliefs in acknowledging Jesus.

We can take many paths in our lives; it is still up to our individual selves to choose to worship and glorify Jesus, the Son of the Living God, with our words and actions. As we go through our Lenten preparation with Holy Week, let us pray that we are closer to Jesus in his holiness. So that in our lives, we join Jesus in his Resurrection.

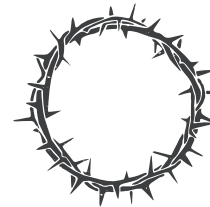

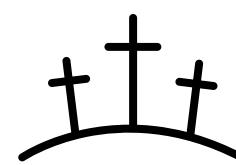
