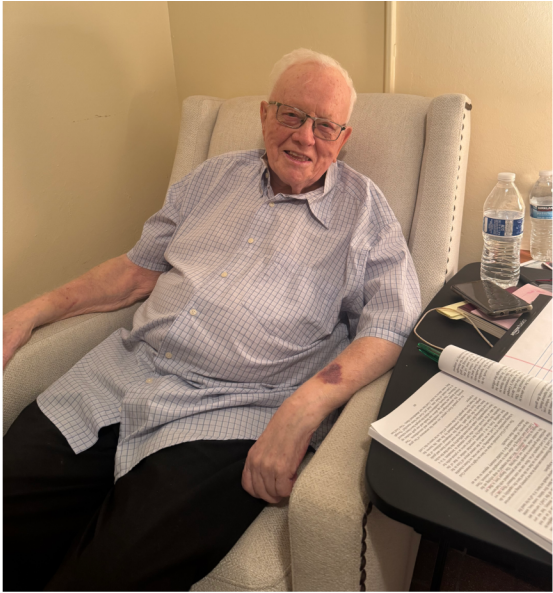

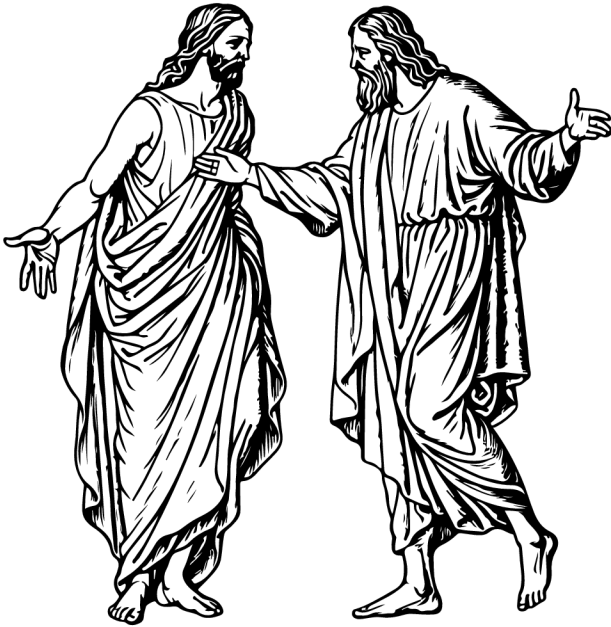

Reflection on the Gospel

Believing in Jesus Christ has its varying degrees as well as encountering him. When the apostles encountered the Risen Christ, not all of them had the same reception. Even the first news of Christ’s resurrection was not fully believed in Luke’s gospel, as Peter ran to the tomb to check. In John’s gospel today, we have the Risen Christ appearing out of nowhere in the disciples’ midst. Thomas wasn’t there and couldn’t believe his brothers’ testimonies.

Thomas experienced the conditions he wanted to fully believe, to put his finger in Jesus’ nail wounds and his hand in Jesus’ side. Was Thomas ashamed of himself for doubting his brothers? We can say that his doubt did not deter him from his duty as an apostle. After all, his ministry ended up in India, where he was martyred. And his ministry was to bring the experience of the Risen Christ to those who didn’t see him and eventually believe.

Which brings us to why the beginning of what we call the New Testament came into being. A preservation of Paul’s letters, the gospel accounts, and John’s Apocalypse. Originally, those who followed The Way or the early Christians thought Jesus was coming back in their lifetimes. As the first witnesses started to be martyred or dying out, witness accounts had to be preserved and circulated further. After all, the Second Coming of Christ occurs in God’s time. Who would’ve thought that these documents persist over centuries and even now?

When it comes to today, all of us encountered the Risen Christ differently. Some of us grew up with the faith, and others had a life-changing event that put us on that same path. Our journey of faith is still the same as the apostles; getting on that path is different for all of us. We don’t have the experience of living with Jesus, but we still can experience Jesus living in us. It is through us that the Risen Christ is still believed in today. Let us pray to our Risen Lord and continually pass down this faith to the next generations of faithful believers.

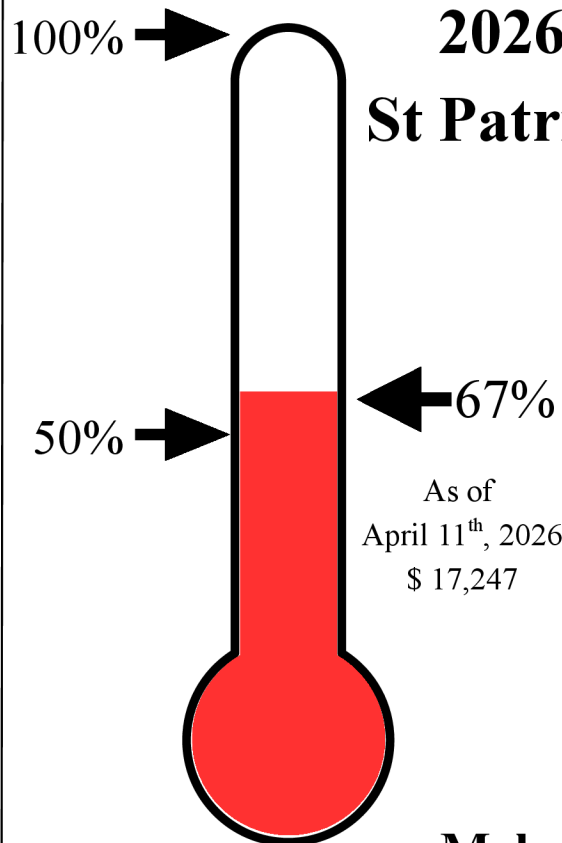
