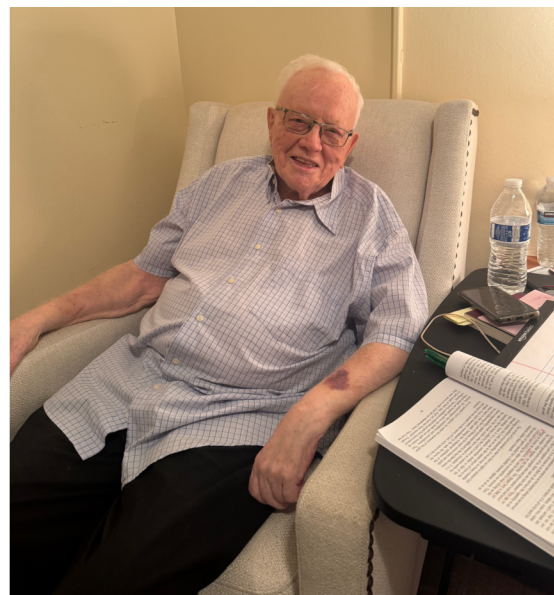

Reflection on the Gospel

Have we been in a situation where a miracle just happened and we were too occupied with something else less important? Imagine Cleopas and his friend realizing Jesus was with them the whole time.

We can be caught up in moments, sometimes forgetting what is important. For the two disciples, what was important for them in the moment was celebrating that Jesus Christ has risen. Jesus, who approached them, wanted to know what they were talking about. Cleopas and his friend didn't recognize him as they saw a stranger who hadn't heard the recent news of Jesus being raised from the dead. The two hearts were "filled with fire" talking about the risen Christ, and did so walking from Emmaus and it was sundown.

Now imagine yourself in Jesus' place, these two disciples of yours are talking about you, you describing what the prophets spoke about you, and they still don't see who is in front of them. What do you do? For Jesus, he broke bread, an action disciples associate with Jesus. The mere act allowed the two to recognize Jesus, not with news or words. They took off running into the night to find the main group of believers. As the scene shifts to the eleven and others, they were excited that Jesus had shown himself to Simon. The two disciples probably looked at each other and agreed that their experience is only possible with Jesus and the breaking of bread. (Aside from Jesus' appearances being 7 miles apart from Jerusalem, as no normal man can appear to do so in such a short span of time).

How about us? Life sometimes overwhelms us, real-world problems that do need our attention. For some of us, we become despondent with what would bring us joy. A possibility that Cleopas and his friend was thinking is the repercussions of such a glorious event of Jesus' Resurrection. Jesus appearing to them was supposed to be a joyful event, instead it turned into a passionate conversation. Let us then find time to *reset* ourselves and remember the joy of Christ's Resurrection.

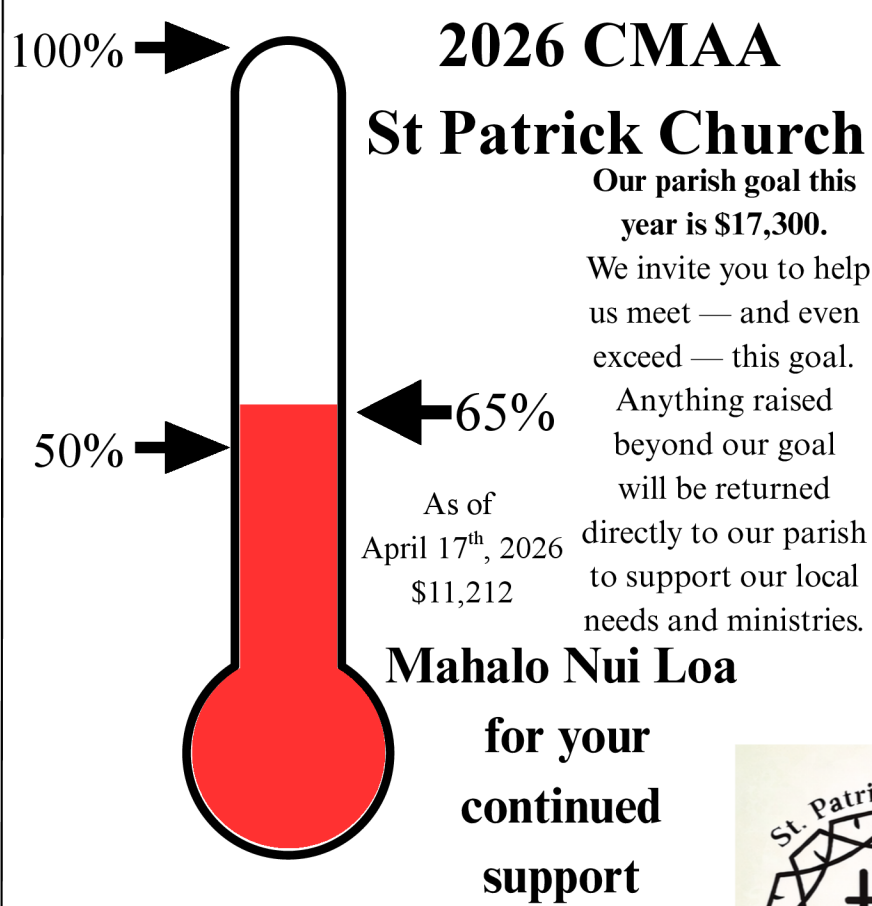
