

Saint Pius of Pietrelcina
Memorial



Saint Pius of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio) (1887-1968) was an Italian Capuchin priest known for his deep prayer, humility, and the gift of the stigmata, the wounds of Christ. He spent countless hours hearing confessions, guiding people back to God through mercy and reconciliation. Padre Pio is remembered for his holiness, miracles, and devotion to the Eucharist and the Blessed Virgin Mary.

September 26th, 2025
Saints Cosmas and Damien
Memorial



Saints Cosmas and Damien were twin brothers and physicians in the 3rd century who offered medical care without charge, earning them the title “unmercenary healers.” They were also devout Christians who used their gifts to witness to the faith and bring others to Christ. Martyred during the persecutions of Diocletian, they are remembered as patron saints of doctors, pharmacists, and all who serve the sick.

September 27th, 2025
Saint Vincent de Paul
Memorial



Saint Vincent de Paul (1581-1660) was a French priest devoted to serving the poor, the sick, and the marginalized. He founded the Congregation of the Mission (Vincentians) and, with St. Louise de Marillac, the Daughters of Charity to continue this mission of service. He is remembered as the patron saint of charitable works and a model of compassion and humility.

Gospel Reflection

The gospel passage this Sunday calls to mind our personal growth. What small actions lead to our present selves, or what are we currently doing to prepare for greater responsibilities?

Being a steward during this time was more than a job; it was his life and social standing. When a steward is dismissed from a household, no other household would accept this steward (the same way as a person is blacklisted in an industry). The steward mentioned was profiting off his master’s debtors, which brings the master to enact an audit. This explains why this dishonest servant in the parable was setting up contingencies in case his master did dismiss him. Instead of being angry at the steward, the master commended what the steward did for his prudence.

Jesus challenges us to take care of our matters as prudently as we can. Especially when we are dealing with things we don’t own. Coming back to the dishonest steward, he was serving himself until he was caught by his master. It is implied that the master allowed the steward to stay with the condition that he doesn’t cheat again. It is probably this small act of lessening debts that changes the master’s mind.

Which comes to the last verse of today’s gospel passage (Luke 16:13), we cannot serve two masters. Hopefully, we call Jesus, master, but as the intent of our actions serves another or ourselves, we would struggle with a conflict in loyalty. How would it look if a servant of God were abusing his fellow servants? It would look horrible, even more so as the act becomes public.

Jesus wants us to be faithful to him in our everyday lives. He calls us to be stewards of all that we have, being responsible and to right our wrongs when we stray.
