



Gospel Reflection

Today's gospel passage speaks of faith and obedience. The first part of the passage is about the potential of faith. The second part of the gospel passage tells of the dispositions of servants.

Can faith be instantly granted or even increased? Instead of entertaining his apostles, Jesus compares the wonders of faith with a mustard seed. It is not this passage that the reader is told how the seed grows into a great tree, but rather having faith comparable to the smallness of the seed. Luke's gospel says having such an amount of faith, one can command a mulberry tree to be cast into the sea. This absurd imagery shows the limitless possibilities of one's faith.

The audience of Luke's gospel is written for Gentiles. To include everyone, the author had included the downtrodden such as slaves. Slaves were not hired help; they were bound to the households they served. Meaning this class of people obeyed their masters. However, the message was for those who are non-slaves as well.

As the apostles asked for faith, they are rather told to reflect inwards to the faith they already have. The ministries that the apostles did during their time did not occur overnight. They were formed and trained as they traveled with Jesus. The apostles learned from and leaned on Jesus, having their wills match Jesus' will. This applies to us, Christians of the present. Bearing the name of Christian, we are to be Christ-like. Like the apostles, this doesn't happen overnight. Our faith in Christ is gained by accepting him, learning about him, and living our lives with him. We can pray for an increase in faith, but we can also refer to centuries of lived experiences of Christ.




‘Ohana in Christ Diocesan Appeal
