September 28th, 2025 Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading

-Amos 6:1a,4-7

"Their wanton revelry shall be done away with."

Responsorial Psalm

-Psalm 146:7,8-9,9-10

"Praise the Lord, my soul!"

Second Reading

-1 Timothy 6:11-16

"Keep the commandment until the appearance of the Lord Jesus Christ."

Gospel Reading

-Luke 16:19-31

"You received what was good, Lazarus what was bad; now he is comforted, whereas you are tormented."



Gospel Reflection

This gospel passage today portrays a man addicted to mammon and another man clinging to God. The rich man and Lazarus were two men that knew each other, as Lazarus would've visited the rich man's house frequently. The nature of Lazarus' visit was more of him trying to survive off of the rich man's scraps.

How rich was the rich man? Luke gives a description of the man wearing purple garments. Dyeing garments purple required an extract from a tiny mollusk, of which about 12,000 of them made 1.4 grams of the dye. Meaning only the excessively rich could afford such garments. This rich man had it all, while the only comfort afforded to Lazarus were dogs licking his sores. Even the gospel acknowledges that dogs are a man's best friend.

As the parable moves to the fate of the rich man and Lazarus, we see Lazarus taken up to Abraham's bosom and the rich man ended up in the netherworld. Seemingly the rich man sees a glorious sky and spots Lazarus. The rich man brazenly begs father Abraham to send Lazarus a drop of water. Out of all the things to ask for, instead of asking for salvation, the rich man wanted a drop of water. A temporary comfort versus an eternal one, the rich man was indeed blind to his own predicament.

Luke 16:31 gives the audience a warning. If the prophets like Moses were not listened to, even more so if someone rose from the dead. This foreshadowing in Luke's gospel speaks to the days of Jesus' resurrection, of where not everyone was convinced that he rose from the dead. The prophets did speak of Jesus' coming and the passion that he will live through.

How about us today? The Bible contains God's word of unquestionable love for us, passed down and preserved for generations. Alongside scripture, the Church also passes down traditions that we perpetuate to the future, both becoming a deposit of our faith (see Dei Verbum 10). We don't need new proofs in order to believe and be faithful in God and the resurrected Christ. Perhaps we need new perspectives on the proofs we already have? Let us pray that our faith remains strong and steadfast, focused on God. So that we too can join Lazarus at Abraham's bosom.




